May Deadlines and Events

Delaware 4-H Foundation Scholarship - Due May 2nd

The Delaware 4-H Foundation is a non-profit organization formed to manage private funds in support of the 4-H youth development program in Delaware. This year they will make available \$4000 to support one or more scholarships offered for Delaware. 4-H members to pursue higher education. Applications must be received in the state office by the due date. Forms are found on the State 4-H website.

Delaware 4-H National Congress - Due May 2nd

Delaware 4-H youth ages 14 and older as of Jan 1st are eligible to apply for selection to participate in the National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, GA on November 22-29, 2016. This award trip recognizes youth for outstanding program/project accomplishments, leadership and citizenship/community service. Kent County Horse Show Ads - Early Submissions May 2nd

The Kent County Horse Show will be held on Sunday, June 12th at the Delaware State Fairgrounds. This event is only successful with the help of the members of Kent County 4-H. 4-H members are asked to help with this fundraiser by selling ads in the horse show program book. All 4-H members are strongly encouraged to assist in selling one or more ads. Even though the ads are solicited for the County Horse Show, the profits help support many 4-H programs and activities throughout the year in Kent County. Businesses can use a business card, camera-ready art, or they can design an ad of their own on paper to use.

Ads are sold as 1/3-page ads (\$20), ½ half page ads (\$30), full-page ads (\$60), and patron ads (\$5-\$15). Additional information about selling ads can be obtained from your 4-H Organizational Leader or from the County 4-H Office. Checks are to be made payable to the Kent County 4-H Leaders Association. All ads and money must be submitted to Heather Crouse (Ad Chairperson) or the County 4-H Office by the final submission date of May 26th. Horse Judging Contest - May 9th

Dairy Judging Contest - May 10th

The County Dairy Judging Contest will take place on May 13th, start time at 6:30pm at the Busker Dairy Farm, 1676 Drapers Corners Rd, Harrington. The contest will be a skillathon-type contest. 

2016 Delaware 4-H Hall of Fame - Nominations Due May 15th

If you know of a special individual who has had a major impact on the 4-H Program in Delaware, now is the time to nominate them for induction into the Delaware 4-H Hall of Fame. Nominations are open through May 15. The 2016 class will be selected in June for induction on October 1, 2016, at the Modern Maturity Center in Dover. Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Who can make nominations?

A. Anyone with an interest in Delaware 4-H can submit a nomination.

Q. Does a nomination have to be screened by a county 4-H office or staff?

A. No. Nominations can be submitted directly to the selection committee. No permissions or sign-offs by anyone are required.

Q. Does the nominee have to be living?

A. No. Nominees who have made a significant contribution to the 4-H movement in Delaware may be living or deceased.

Q. Does the nominee have to live in Delaware?

A. No. Nominees who have made significant contributions to Delaware 4-H are eligible regardless of where they live, even if they have never lived in Delaware.

Q. Does the nominee have to have been a 4-H member?

A. No. The Delaware 4-H Hall of Fame is open to anyone who has made a significant contribution to 4-H in Delaware, even if they were never a 4-H member. It can include 4-H or other extension staff, donors, volunteers or others. In the case of staff however, they must have been retired or deceased for at least 3 years prior to induction. This rule coincides with the criteria for the National 4-H Hall of Fame.

Q. How many laureates will be inducted?

A. The number of laureates will be determined by the planning committee and selection committee.

Q. How often will the Delaware 4-H Hall of Fame induct a new class?

A. It has been proposed that a Delaware 4-H Hall of Fame class be inducted in even numbered years.

Q. Will inductees into the Delaware 4-H Hall of Fame be submitted to the National 4-H Hall of Fame for consideration?

A. No. The two processes are different. Nominations to the National 4-H Hall of Fame can be submitted only by the State 4-H Office.

Federal Junior Duck Stamp Contest - Congratulations to Rain Vasey

The winning entry from Delaware for the Federal Junior Duck Stamp contest was selected on Tuesday, March 29, as artistic renderings of waterfowl and conservation messages from students in grades K-12 were judged at the New Castle County Cooperative Extension Building to determine which would represent the state in the national contest. Participating competitors selected a waterfowl from a list of species on the official U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service webpage and drew a live portrayal of that species in its habitat demonstrating its natural behavior.

Iris Fang’s entry from the grades 4-6 division, an oil pastel rendering of a northern pintail duck titled “Joining the Flock,” was selected as the best in show and will move on to the national Federal Junior Duck Stamp Design Contest, where it will have the opportunity to be chosen as the Federal Junior Duck Stamp for 2016.

Rain Vasey’s conservation message — “a clean environment means clean wings over water” — was selected to move on to the national contest, as well. Vasey was also in the grades 4-6 division.

Autumn Starcher, Junior Duck Stamp Program state coordinator, said that there were 31 statewide entries this year spread out over four different age groups and that the competition was a great way to get students exposed to science, technology, engineering, art and math (STEAM) curriculum.

“A lot of the coolest science stuff you can think of has a lot of art integrated in, and so integrating art into these science programs really helps foster creativity and innovation,” Starcher said. “It’s a good way to get kids who might not like science so much and are interested in art, or the kids who don’t like art and are interested in science, interested in other programs and see how they’re integrated together. I think that is probably my favorite part of the program.”

Starcher said those interested should participate next year. “If you’re interested in getting your school or church group involved, you can reach out to me or the local 4-H office,” said Starcher.

The 4-H Junior Duck Stamp Program is an art and science based program that encourages wetland and waterfowl conservation through sharing and expression with art, and meets monthly in the fall and early winter. Delaware 4-H Foundation Announces 2016 Scholarship Opportunities



The Delaware 4-H Foundation, Inc. is a non-profit organization formed to manage private funds in support of the 4-H youth development program in Delaware. As an educational organization, the foundation encourages young adults to pursue education and training beyond high school. Funds are available to support one or more scholarships offered for Delaware 4-H members to pursue higher education. This award is to recognize continued 4-H leadership.

To qualify, applicants must have completed five years as a 4-H member, with at least three of those in Delaware. Recipients must be high school graduates and be enrolled full-time at any two- or four-year institution of higher education for the fall or spring semester of the 2016-17 academic year. Applicants may be enrolled in any area of study. High school seniors will be evaluated separately from matriculated college students. Scholarships will only be awarded once per individual; those not awarded are encouraged to apply again.

Scholarship selection will be based upon 4-H leadership, 4-H involvement, school/ extracurricular/ community involvement, academic performance, and two letters of reference. Applications may be downloaded from the [State 4-H website](#). Please limit application information to space provided. Only current transcript and two (2) letters of reference may be attached. Incomplete application packages will not be considered.

Scholarship recipients will be announced at the Delaware State Fair. Scholarship checks will be issued to scholarship winners AFTER completion of their first semester. Awardees are required to submit a transcript from the first completed semester PRIOR to the check being issued.

Delaware State Fair Online Entries Open April 1

It's that time already! Delaware State Fair online entries for all classes, including livestock open on April 1. Entries close on June 1.

Delaware State Fair Livestock Handbook Department Highlights for 2016

Entry fees for beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, swine and goats will be \$5.00 per class with the exception of showmanship and group classes. A sliding scale for premiums paid will be utilized starting with the 2016 fair.

- Beef cattle tie out times have been established starting in 2016. Tie out between the horse barns will be allowed from 9:00 PM to 9:00 AM. Clean out is **required nightly** and all manure is to be brought to the designated manure bins. All tie out areas must be cleaned completely out by Sunday July 31st at noon, Exhibitors who do not comply will forfeit premiums.
- Crossbred gilts and barrows for the open barrow show must be 200-300 lbs. Any hogs not making these weights for these classes must be removed immediately following weigh in on Saturday morning and may not be shown.
- A minimum weight for tagging of market hogs is in place again this year. If your hog does not meet the minimum requirement for that tagging date, it will not be tagged by fair officials. You may bring it back to another tagging date but must meet the minimum for that next date. The minimum weights are:

May 7, 2016- 75 lbs.

May 14, 2016- 80 lbs.

May 20, 2016- 85 lbs.

May 24, 2016- 85 lbs.

- *Goat Exhibitors*- beginning with the 2016 Delaware State Fair, all pygmy goats will be required to be registered. Registration papers will be checked beginning in 2016.

Delaware State Fair Livestock Tagging Dates for Market Animals

All market animals must be identified with a Delaware State Fair ear tag in order to be eligible. This applies to market steers, market lambs, market goats and market hogs. Feeder calves and breed animals do not need to be tagged.

May 7, 2016- New Castle County- Newark- Cook's Farm- 9:00am- 11:00 am

May 7, 2016- Sussex County- Georgetown REC- 9:00 am-11:00 am**

May 14 2016- Kent County- DSF- 9:00 am- 11:00 am

May 20, 2016- Kent County- DSF- 6:00 pm- 9:00 pm- Tagging for Jackpot participants

May 24, 2016- FINAL TAGGING DATE- DSF- 5:00 pm- 8:00 pm

**Sussex County does not have the ability to weigh steers so if you want your steer to be weighed at the time of tagging, it must be brought to one of the Delaware State Fair tagging dates. To be eligible for the Delaware Farm Bureau Rate of Gain Contest, you must weigh and tag at the location for your county.

The conference will be held concurrently with the World Dairy Expo. National 4-H Dairy Conference delegates may not participate in the National 4-H Dairy Cattle Judging Contest or exhibit cattle at the World Dairy Expo due to time constraints. PQA Certification

All Junior Market Hog Exhibitors are required to have a current PQA certification in order to exhibit a market hog at the Delaware State Fair. There are currently three options for obtaining PQA certification. The class certification option is open to any age but youth under the age of 8 (computed as of Jan 1 of the current year) must have a parent attend the class with them as national program guidelines do not permit a child under 8 to hold their own certification. Certification received through the classroom option is valid for one year.



Youth over the age of 12 (computed as of Jan 1 of the current year) have the option of taking a multiple choice test in lieu of attending classroom training. The benefit of the testing option is that certification may last for longer than one year, depending on the age of the youth at test time. Youth must score 70% or better to pass the test and can take versions of the test up to three times in one sitting to pass.

There is an online training, testing, and certification option. Delivered in the form of an engaging, interactive online module, the new online option allows participants to learn, test, and become certified in Youth PQA Plus. For youth age 12 and under, a parent log-in for security is required. Youth only need to complete one of these three options for obtaining certification.

Beginners who participate in the online module will receive a one year certification. Intermediate and senior youth, depending on their age at the time of completing the course and if they pass the exam, could receive a three year certification, or certification lasting until they age out of their division if it's less than three years, and move into the next age division. If an intermediate or senior youth member does not pass their exam online, they will receive a one year certification. 2016 Delaware 4-H Horse of the Year Winner Named

Jointly sponsored by the Delaware 4-H Horse Advisory Committee and the Peter Stone Model Horse Company, the Horse of the Year contest offered 4-H members the opportunity to nominate a horse or pony as the Delaware 4-H Horse of the Year. Participants were required to submit an essay of 500-1000 words on the topic of, "If Your Horse was a Superhero, Who Would it be and Why?" along with 4 photographs of the nominated horse or pony. Essays were scored based on the ability to answer the topic, the emotional impact and meeting the essay requirements by a panel of 6 judges with equine backgrounds and experience as 4-H volunteers. Nominators were not required to own the horses or ponies entered.

The 2016 winner of the Delaware 4-H Horse of the Year is Ms. Ashley Tilghman, age 14 of Dover, Delaware who nominate her 7 year old grey Thoroughbred named WaChacha. Ashley is a member of the Mane Squad 4-H Club. In her essay, Ashley wrote about how Chacha has the qualities of Wonder Woman; agile, lots of endurance, quick reflexes, very intelligent, honest and beautiful. She compared Wonder Woman learning to live amongst us and being a "normal" human being to Chacha adapting all that she knew from racing in order to become a show horse.

Ashley will be presented with a custom made and custom painted model of her horse WaChacha at the Kent County 4-H Achievement banquet in October, generously created and donated by Peter Stone Model Horses.
