Delaware 4-H State Camp Applications - Began Postmarking March 1st

Age requirements are based on 4-H age as of January 1st. Applications must be completed online or mailed to the State 4-H Office per the instructions provided with the application with either a deposit or payment in full to be accepted. **Please do not mail them to the Kent County 4-H Office, as this will delay their arrival to the State 4-H Office.**

Clothing & Textile Showcase - Entries Due April 4th - Contest April 9th

The Clothing & Textile Showcase will be held on Saturday, April 9th at Lake Forest High School in Felton at 7:00 pm. Participants will arrive by 2:00 pm to participate in interviews and prepare for the event. 4-H members will be showcasing their sewing construction skills and consumer skills in both the Clothing Construction event as well as the Ready to Wear event. Entries for the County Sewing Contest will also be on display. Intent Forms were due March 21st.

Spring 4-H/FFA Dairy Show - April 4th

RE: Important Information – Exhibit Entry for the Delaware State Fair

Dear Delaware 4-H Member:

Entries for the Delaware State Fair will begin April 1st. Please be aware that the State Fair will be utilizing a new exhibit software this year, FairEntry, which is directly connected with 4-H Online system which we use in Delaware 4-H for our enrollment system. Due to this connection, ALL 4-H YOUTH who were enrolled in Delaware 4-H by the advertised deadline of March 1st will enter their exhibits using their sign-in email and password from 4-H Online.

The State Fair just recently sent out an email to all past fair exhibitors providing them information and instructions related to the new FairEntry system. This information can also be found on the state fair website under the “Exhibitor” tab. Please take time to review this information prior to April 1st or the date you enter your exhibits and contact the state fair if you have any questions. I would like to highlight some important aspects of this information:

1. To enter exhibits for the fair, go to the Delaware State Fair website (www.delawarestatefair.com) and click on the Exhibitors Tab. You will see a link that will redirect you to the FairEntry website. There will be two logos to click on in order to enter exhibits – “4-H Online” and “FairEntry.”
2. As a Delaware 4-H member, you will enter through the “4-H Online” tab on this page using your Delaware 4-H Online Enrollment email and password. By entering this way, your personal data will automatically transfer for you over to the exhibit system. Please take the time to have your email and password that you set up previously in the 4-H Online enrollment system available. I encourage you to test it out on the Delaware 4-H online enrollment system in advance if you have any questions.
3. It is highly recommended that every exhibitor has their own exhibitor account. However, 4-H families can sign into the exhibitor system and set up multiple exhibitors under the same exhibitor account. When initially signing in using your “4-H Online” email and password referenced above, all 4-H youth aged 19 years old and under associated with your account will appear. You can proceed to add exhibits for each of these 4-H youth. In addition, if as a parent or volunteer listed on this same account, you also want to enter exhibits in other state fair departments, you can create additional non-4-H member exhibitors on this same account in order to keep all related records linked together.

NOTE: Any 4-H Adult Volunteer in the “4-H Online” enrollment system who wants to enter their own individual exhibits in other departments with the state fair, but do not have 4-H youth 19 years and under on their record, should enter their exhibits by clicking on the FairEntry logo on the exhibitor page. You will not be able to go through the 4-H Online logo to enter your exhibits.

4. In the 4-H Department, there are certain classes that require you to enter your exhibit entry under your club name. These classes include: 1) Club Educational Displays (Window Displays), 2) Consumer Bowl Team, and 3) Avian Bowl Team. These respective classes have been set up differently in the fair system to allow for this process. However, the 4-H club will be required to set up their CLUB ACCOUNT RECORD by entering through the FairEntry logo on the exhibitor page. This is required since the 4-H Online Enrollment system is set up by individual member records, and not by CLUB records.
5. In the previous instructions shared by the state fair, it was stated that it would require all exhibitors to go through the Payment System which would require them to enter a VALID credit card number as part of this process. Please be aware that a system modification has been completed and those exhibitors who have NO FEES associated with their exhibits will now NOT be required to do this.
6. Please be aware that you can check that your entries have been accepted by checking your status on your account dashboard or via an email that will be sent to you by FairEntry.
7. ALL ENTRIES must be entered by June 1st. We encourage you to take care of this matter in advance of this date and not wait until the last day the system is open to do this. In addition, please be aware that Entry tags will again be distributed to 4-H members through their 4-H Club Organizational Leaders.

We look forward to seeing your exhibits in the 4-H Department at the Delaware State Fair. The Delaware 4-H Staff will assist you with any questions you have with the new state fair exhibitor system, but 4-H members are encouraged to contact the Delaware State Fair directly with any questions you may have regarding this process.

Horticulture and Wildlife Judging Contests—April 27th

The county contests will take place at the Kent Extension Office on Wednesday, April 27th from 4:30—7:00 pm. Training materials are on the State 4-H website. Plan to participate in these and test your knowledge in these respective 4-H project areas. Top 10 ranking seniors will be qualified to enter these contests at the Delaware State Fair.

May Deadlines and Events

Delaware 4-H Foundation Scholarship - Due May 2nd

The Delaware 4-H Foundation is a non-profit organization formed to manage private funds in support of the 4-H youth development program in Delaware. This year they will make available \$4000 to support one or more scholarships offered for Delaware. 4-H members to pursue higher education. Applications must be received in the state office by the due date. Forms are found on the State 4-H website.

Delaware 4-H National Congress - Due May 2nd

Delaware 4-H youth ages 14 and older as of Jan 1st are eligible to apply for selection to participate in the National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, GA on November 25-29, 2016. This award trip recognizes youth for outstanding program/project accomplishments, leadership and citizenship/community service. Application and more information can be found on the State 4-H website.

Horse Judging Contest - May 9th

The County Horse Judging Contest will take place on May 9th at 6:30 pm at Gene Dill's Farm, 2408 Still Rd, Wyoming, DE 19934. All participants must be present at the contest start time. Live horses will be evaluated.

Dairy Judging Contest - May 10th

The County Dairy Judging Contest will take place on May 10th, start time at 6:30pm at the Busker Dairy Farm, 1676 Drapers Corners Rd, Harrington. The contest will be a skillathon-type contest. The contest guide is posted on the State 4-H website under "State & National Events & "Judging". Plan to participate in this contest to test your knowledge in this project area.

Club News Due for June Clover - Due May 13th

2016 Delaware 4-H Hall of Fame - Nominations Due May 15th

If you know of a special individual who has had a major impact on the 4-H Program in Delaware, now is the time to nominate them for induction into the Delaware 4-H Hall of Fame. Nominations are open through May 15. The 2016 class will be selected in June for induction on October 1, 2016, at the Modern Maturity Center in Dover. Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Who can make nominations?

A. Anyone with an interest in Delaware 4-H can submit a nomination.

Q. Does a nomination have to be screened by a county 4-H office or staff?

A. No. Nominations can be submitted directly to the selection committee. No permissions or sign-offs by anyone are required.

Q. Does the nominee have to be living?

A. No. Nominees who have made a significant contribution to the 4-H movement in Delaware may be living or deceased.

Q. Does the nominee have to live in Delaware?

A. No. Nominees who have made significant contributions to Delaware 4-H are eligible regardless of where they live, even if they have never lived in Delaware.

Q. Does the nominee have to have been a 4-H member?

A. No. The Delaware 4-H Hall of Fame is open to anyone who has made a significant contribution to 4-H in Delaware, even if they were never a 4-H member. It can include 4-H or other extension staff, donors, volunteers or others. In the case of staff however, they must have been retired or deceased for at least 3 years prior to induction. This rule coincides with the criteria for the National 4-H Hall of Fame.

Q. How many laureates will be inducted?

A. The number of laureates will be determined by the planning committee and selection committee.

Q. How often will the Delaware 4-H Hall of Fame induct a new class?

A. It has been proposed that a Delaware 4-H Hall of Fame class be inducted in even numbered years.

Q. Will inductees into the Delaware 4-H Hall of Fame be submitted to the National 4-H Hall of Fame for consideration?

A. No. The two processes are different. Nominations to the National 4-H Hall of Fame can be submitted only by the State 4-H Office.

Delaware State Fair Online Entries Open April 1

It's that time already! Delaware State Fair online entries for all classes, including livestock open on April 1. Entries close on June 1.

Delaware State Fair Livestock Handbook Department Highlights for 2016

- Entry fees for beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, swine and goats will be \$5.00 per class with the exception of showmanship and group classes. A sliding scale for premiums paid will be utilized starting with the 2016 fair.
- Beef cattle tie out times have been established starting in 2016. Tie out between the horse barns will be allowed from 9:00 PM to 9:00 AM. Clean out is **required nightly** and all manure is to be brought to the designated manure bins. All tie out areas must be cleaned completely out by Sunday July 31st at noon, Exhibitors who do not comply will forfeit premiums.
- Crossbred gilts and barrows for the open barrow show must be 200-300 lbs. Any hogs not making these weights for these classes must be removed immediately following weigh in on Saturday morning and may not be shown.
- A minimum weight for tagging of market hogs is in place again this year. If your hog does not meet the minimum requirement for that tagging date, it will not be tagged by fair officials. You may bring it back to another tagging date but must meet the minimum for that next date. The minimum weights are:

May 7, 2016- 75 lbs.

May 14, 2016- 80 lbs.

May 20, 2016- 85 lbs.

May 24, 2016- 85 lbs.

- *Goat Exhibitors-* beginning with the 2016 Delaware State Fair, all pygmy goats will be required to be registered. Registration papers will be checked beginning in 2016.

Delaware State Fair Livestock Tagging Dates for Market Animals

All market animals must be identified with a Delaware State Fair ear tag in order to be eligible. This applies to market steers, market lambs, market goats and market hogs. Feeder calves and breed animals do not need to be tagged.

To be eligible for the Delaware Farm Bureau Rate of Gain Contest, you must weigh and tag at the location for your county.

PQA Certification

All Junior Market Hog Exhibitors are required to have a current PQA certification in order to exhibit a market hog at the Delaware State Fair. There are currently three options for obtaining PQA certification. The class certification option is open to any age but youth under the age of 8 (computed as of Jan 1 of the current year) must have a parent attend the class with them as national program guidelines do not permit a child under 8 to hold their own certification. Certification received through the classroom option is valid for one year.

Youth over the age of 12 (computed as of Jan 1 of the current year) have the option of taking a multiple choice test in lieu of attending classroom training. The benefit of the

testing option is that certification may last for longer than one year, depending on the age of the youth at test time. Youth must score 70% or better to pass the test and can take versions of the test up to three times in one sitting to pass.

There is an online training, testing, and certification option. Delivered in the form of an engaging, interactive online module, the new online option allows participants to learn, test, and become certified in Youth PQA Plus. For youth age 12 and under, a parent log-in for security is required. Youth only need to complete one of these three options for obtaining certification.

Beginners who participate in the online module will receive a one year certification. Intermediate and senior youth, depending on their age at the time of completing the course and if they pass the exam, could receive a three year certification, or certification lasting until they age out of their division if it's less than three years, and move into the next age division. If an intermediate or senior youth member does not pass their exam online, they will receive a one year certification. 

Activity Name: Hula Hoop Food Group Relay

Procedure:

1. Break youth into two groups , or more if necessary.
2. Have adequate space for youth to hula hoop down a lane while walking a distance
3. Begin the race by asking food group questions attached to each team. A team cannot start unless they answer a question correctly
4. Once question is answered youth will hula hoop while simultaneously walking down race way distance and back, this is a relay style race, so youth will pass off the hula hoop to their next teammate, until all have a turn.
5. The first group to complete the race wins, however they cannot officially win until another food group question is answered correctly, so the other team may steal the win!

Reflect: Ask Youth

1. What type of exercise category does the hula-hoop relay fit in? Answer: Cardio

Apply: Ask Youth

1. How will you apply nutrition knowledge learned in this course to your life?
2. How will you apply exercise knowledge learned in this course to your life?

Building confidence in various exercise types

Supplies:
1 deck of cards
Yoga poses sheet

Time Required:
15-30 minutes

Activity Name: Wild Card Exercising

Procedure:

1. Gather youth in large group facing the instructor
2. The instructor will hold a deck of cards, each card has a different exercise (key attached), have students take turns selecting a card from the deck that the group will complete. The suit will indicate the exercise, the number on the card will indicate how many of that exercise to complete.
3. Exercises can be modified to age appropriate activities. Numbers can be changed to seconds held depending on activity.

Reflect: Ask Youth

1. Which activities worked which muscle groups?
2. Which activities were stretching, cardio, or strength?

Apply: Ask Youth

1. Would you be likely to do any of these exercises at home?
2. Do you have a deck of cards at home to try and draw a card each morning to complete an exercise?
3. Would you be able to teach this game to others?

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Lobster

Squat with toes and knees pointing towards the wall. Place arms and hands in position as shown. Pretend fingers are pinchers and make funny faces at your friends. Swing arms down and cross, while squatting up and down at the same time to warm up the muscles. Hold the position for 8 seconds when you feel slightly out of breath.



Mountain

Stand straight with feet planted firmly on the floor. Feet should be slightly apart (about 2 fists in between). This is the position to return to when you wish to restart the group. Arms should be comfortable at sides, face relaxed, shoulders back and down.



Windmill

Start from standing position with arms extended at sides, cross over body and go as close to a toe touch as comfortable. Come back up and cross do other side. Repeat 8 times.



Waterfall

From Mountain position lean slightly back with arms and fingers pointing behind you as shown. Hold about 4-8 seconds as you feel comfortable. Return to Mountain.



Bird

From Mountain position stand on tiptoes (knees slightly bent). Turn arms behind you and commence flight! Hold for 8 seconds or as students are able.



Rag Doll

With knees slightly bent, bend slowly towards the ground. Participants do not need to touch the ground, anywhere on the leg is fine. Just hang and relax for 8-16 seconds.



Chair

Start from standing position with arms extended at sides, cross over body and go as close to a toe touch as comfortable. Come back up and cross. Do other side. Repeat 8 times.



Tree

From Mountain position lean slightly back with arms and fingers pointing behind you as shown. Hold about 4-8 seconds as you feel comfortable. Return to Mountain.



Frog

From Mountain squat down with feet flat on the floor and hands flat on the floor. Youth may enjoy jumping, saying "ribbit" and having fun acting like frogs. Hold the position for 16 seconds if youth choose not to jump.



Dog

From mountain, extend both feet behind you and make a v with your body. Heels do not need to touch the floor.



Gorilla

From Frog position, stand up a little taller in a gorilla-like position, swinging arms back and forth. Youth will enjoy the chance to swing their arms and act like this animal. Swing arms back and forth at least 4 times, more if the youth are having fun.



Warrior 1

From Dog position, bring your right foot up to between your hands, and slowly rise your body up until you are in a lunge position. The back foot should be turned away from the opposite foot, hips forward, and arms up. Hold for 8 seconds, return to dog position, and bring up left foot between hands, raise into a lunge, and turn right back foot away from the other as in picture below. Hold again for 8 seconds.
